### **PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE**

Dear parents and carers,

We made it! Congratulations to everyone- staff, students and parents – for the way you have all handled this challenging period of remote and flexible learning. It has certainly had its highs and lows but now we can look forward to returning to normality (or close to).

For students in years 3-6 returning to school, here are some reminders:

 All school gates will be opened and parents/carers are asked to maintain 1.5m from others whilst entering/exiting and whilst on school grounds.

2) Parents/carers of prep students only are permitted to drop students off/pick students up from classrooms. Parents/carers are not permitted on site before 8:45AM and before 3:15PM, and must maintain social distancing rules whilst on site meaning that no adults are permitted to congregate on site before or after collecting their child. Essentially, please collect your prep child and leave the school grounds as quickly as possible.

3) Parents/carers of students in years 1-6 must drop off and collect students from one of our gates (unless there are specific circumstances that require you to come onsite or you are collecting/dropping off students to our Out of School Hours Care program). Please let your child know where you will meet them, and remember to maintain social distancing rules whilst waiting.

### Absences

Please text any absences to 0477 343 814 or call 5721 3491. It is a legal requirement that all absesnces are explained.

### Signing Students In/Out

Please sign your child or children in and out at the office if they are arriving at school late or being picked up early. For early pick-ups, we ask that parents/carers please go directly to the office.

### Late Arrivals

All classes (including specialist classes) will begin at 9:05am so we ask that students please make their way in to classrooms by 8:55am. We recommend that students enter classrooms between 8:45am and 8:55am to prepare for their day.

### **School Hours**

Just a friendly reminder that staff supervision of students in the yard before school begins at 8:45am. Prior to this, all staff are in a staff briefing each morning and thus cannot monitor the yard. We understand that this timing may be difficult for some families which is why we have Out of School Hours care available each morning from 6:30am. Alternatively, should you wish to drop your child off before 8:45am, you may do so but please be aware that formal supervision is not available at this time and we recommend that students do not arrive before 8:30am.

**4)** No parents, carers or siblings are to enter classrooms.

5) All contact with teachers must be made viaSeesaw or email. Teachers will not be available fordiscussions with parents in person before or after school.

6) Please minimise visits to our school office and remember that only 2 adults are permitted in the office waiting area at a time.

7) Please remember that if your child is unwell, they must not attend school. Any student with a fever, cough or sore throat will be isolated at school and parents/carers will be called for immediate collection.

### School Council

On Monday night we had our second school council meeting for the term, again via Zoom. At this meeting the following items were addressed:

 Annual Report to the School Community – I presented this report to the school council for discussion. It has been approved, submitted to the DET and will be uploaded it to our website.

2) School camps – We are still awaiting further information from the DET relating to whether or not we will be permitted to run camps in terms 3 and 4, and the changes we would need to make to our current planning in light of social distancing requirements. We will be making a decision at our next meeting in the last week of term.  3) Budget – Our 2020 school budget was revised in light of Covid-19 expenses and plans for upcoming expenditure. Major additions include:

- the installation of security cameras around the school,
- the purchase of additional iPads for our teaching staff to use in order to continue making videos that will support small group work, and
- the renovation of our basketball courts. This is an exciting project that includes one rubberised court, one artificial turf court and two acrylic courts as well as a long jump and several 4 square courts.

**4) Out of School Hours Care** – The vacation program for Term 2 was approved and it was agreed that in the future (when we are again allowed to run excursions), we will offer an opt out for students who would prefer to stay at school.

### **Congratulations Mr Norden!**

A huge congratulations to Mr Norden who is the inaugural recipient of the Public Education Foundation's Techers Mutual Bank Victorian Mid-Career Scholarship.

This scholarship will enable Xavier to build partnerships and connections with, and learn from, globally recognised education experts at Stanford University. In particular it will allow him to bring further evidencebased research to our school in the areas of mathematics and growth mindsets.

This is a very exciting opportunity for Xavier and our school.

### Headlice

We endeavour to keep our school as free from headlice as possible. As such, any student who has live headlice or eggs will be sent home for treatment. They can return as soon as the treatment has occurred but please remember that it is vital that bedding, hats, clothing and any other soft furnishing/teddies that your child has used need to be washed. If you require a treatment kit, please let the office know.

### **Bike Storage & Locks**

We encourage our students to ride their bikes to school and would like to inform due to high numbers at the school now, we will require bikes to be stored in and out of the bike storage facility. Each student is required to have their own bike locks and are responsible for safely securing them to the bike racks.

### **Compass Parent Portal**

If you haven't accessed the Compass Parent Portal please call into the office for your unique log in letter. This is vital for informing of student absences, emailing your child's teacher and accessing of student reports.

### Sanitary Dispensers

This week, the Victorian Government installed a sanitary item dispenser in the female toilets at our school. This was part of an initiative to provide free sanitary pads and tampons in every government school from Term 3, 2019 because being able to access sanitary products shouldn't be a barrier for girls and young women to getting the most out of their education.

Please note that the use of these sanitary items is completely voluntary. Unfortunately we were unable to provide pre-warning as we were not aware of the date of installation.

### Introducing Free Pads and Tampons in Government Schools

The Victorian Government is providing free sanitary pads and tampons in every government school because being able to access sanitary products shouldn't be a barrier for girls and young women to getting the most out of their education.

This initiative aims to:

- provide students with the confidence that sanitary items will be readily accessible at school
- relieve students of the stigma, anxiety and discomfort that can be associated with menstruation and its management
- ease the cost of living for families.



Lack of easy access to sanitary items can negatively affect attitudes, behaviours and equal participation in sport and everyday school activities. By providing access to sanitary items these barriers can be reduced.

The Government's investment will ensure sanitary pads and tampons are available at school to help female students to manage their periods with greater ease and less embarrassment and to normalise periods as a healthy part of growing up.

### **Product Information**

Students will be able to choose from two Libra Products

- 1. Libra Tampons Regular
- 2. Libra Ultrathin Pads with Wings Regular



### Why these products were chosen:

Libra's product usage study (females 10-18) showed that pads (day) are the most popular, with Ultrathin Regular pads with wings the most used amongst girls this age. For tampons, non-applicator tampons are preferred, with regular absorbency tampon most used.

### How will the sanitary items be accessed?

Dispensers will be allocated and installed within the nominated school bathrooms to allow easy access for students.

Dimensions: 45cm W x 55cm L





The use of sanitary items provided at school will be entirely voluntary.

Providing both sanitary pads and tampons allows students to make a choice based on their own needs, cultural beliefs, maturity and parental preferences.
