## Signing Students In/Out

 Please sign your child or children in and out at the office if they are arriving at school late or being picked up early. For early pick-ups, we ask that parents/carers please go directly to the office.
## Late Arrivals

All classes (including specialist classes) will begin at 9:05am so we ask that students please make their way in to classrooms by 8:55 am.

## School Hours

Just a friendly reminder that staff supervision of students in the yard before school begins at 8:45am. Prior to this, all staff are in a staff briefing each morning and thus cannot monitor the yard. We understand that this timing may be difficult for some families which is why we have Out of School Hours care available each morning from 6:30am. Alternatively, should you wish to drop your child off before 8:45am, you may do so but please be aware that formal supervision is not available at this time and we recommend that students do not arrive before 8:30am.

## Staff Correspondence

 Staff can be contacted between 8:30 am and 4:30 pm on their working days. Out of hours contact may not be responded to untit the following work day.Our Book Parade will take place this coming Monday first thing in the morning (just after gAM) in the middle area. We encourage students to dress up as a favourite character, and invite parents, grandparents, carers and friends to come along and join in the celebrations.
Following the parade, visitors are invited into classrooms to read with the kids and share in the joy of reading together.

At first break we will serve the hotdogs that the Parents and Friends committee are organising. For those students who have swimming on Monday, we will deliver the hot dogs early (at 10:45 prior to getting ready for swimming at 11AM). Swimmers won't be able to get into the pool with face/body paint so we will have baby wipes on hand to remove any paint after the parade. Coloured hair spray is also best avoided for those year levels. We originally had the Book Parade planned for a day where there was no scheduled swimming but unfortunately a late change to the swimming timetable was necessary so we apologise for the overlap.

In other news, last week we had six staff attend a mathematics professional learning day in Ballarat with Jo Boaler presenting. This was an amazing opportunity as Xavier Norden last year had to travel all the way to America to see Jo in action! Here is an account of the day from the teachers who attended:

Last Thursday a team of 7 teachers ventured across to Ballarat to participate in a Mathematics Professional Development Day with internationally renowned presenter Jo Boaler. Jo is the co-founder of You-Cubed which focusses on inspiring and empowering teachers to develop Growth Mindsets for students in Maths. The team came away with some awesome strategies to use in the classroom to engage students and they will be sharing these with the rest of the teaching staff next week. Thanks to Mr Norden and Tan for organising and to Mrs Solimo, Mrs Allen, Ms Raison, Ms Pederick, Mr D'Antonio, Miss Johnston \& Mr Ricardi for making the voyage to Ballarat.


On Monday evening the School Council group met for our first meeting of the term. During this meeting we:

- Approved the vacation care plan for our Out of School Hours Care program. A $\$ 5$ per session price rise was also approved, resulting from increasing staffing and food costs, increases to child care subsidies and the fact that we hadn't raised the cost of sessions in more than 5 years.
- Added a long sleeve polo with our school logo to the approved Winter uniform list, to be sold at Worklocker.
- Approved the first two curriculum days for the 2024 school year (Monday January 29th and Tuesday January 30th).
- Approved upcoming fundraising events proposed by the Parents and Friends Committee(see below) and the West Fest end of year event (more information to come soon).
- Discussed and approved a revised ICT Parent Contribution Levy for 2024.
- Approved a streamlined method for ordering stationary packs for families for the 2024 school year.

The school council group will be undertaking finance training at our next meeting, having previously completed the governance training (and the school council presidents training completed by our president Tom). Thanks to the team for the time you are each putting in, and for another productive meeting!

The Parents and Friends crew met on Wednesday evening to finalise plans for the hot dog lunch, Father's Day breakfast and upcoming major fundraising events including:
