Signing Students In/Out

Please sign your child or children in and out at the office if they are arriving at school late or being picked up early. For early pick-ups, we ask that parents/carers please go directly to the office.

Late Arrivals

All classes (including specialist classes) will begin at 9:05am so we ask that students please make their way in to classrooms by 8:55am.

School Hours

Just a friendly reminder that staff supervision of students in the yard before school begins at 8:45am. Prior to this, all staff are in a staff briefing each morning and thus cannot monitor the yard. We understand that this timing may be difficult for some families which is why we have Out of School Hours care available each morning from 6:30am. Alternatively, should you wish to drop your child off before 8:45am, you may do so but please be aware that formal supervision is not available at this time and we recommend that students do not arrive before 8:30am.

Staff can be contacted between 8:30am and 4:30pm on their working days. Out of hours contact may not be responded to until the following work day.

Our first P&F meeting for the year was due to be held at 7pm on Wednesday 17th February - but in light of the latest Covid Lockdowns, this has been postponed to a later date.

First School Council Meeting (Monday 8th Feb)

On Monday night we held our first school council meeting of the year. At this meeting the following was achieved:

- Our draft 2021 budget was approved (to be confirmed once we receive our actual student numbers at census on the 26th of Feb),
- Our Annual Improvement Plan was approved (a summary of which is included in this newsletter), and
- Our Anaphylaxis policy and Asthma policy were both updated and ratified.

Anti Bullying Day

Next Friday we will be running our annual Anti-Bullying Day, this year focusing on celebrating differences through the theme, 'A Day of Difference'. To help celebrate this important theme, students are encouraged to wear something different i.e. a different hair style/colour, different clothes, etc. On the day, students will be involved in a range of activities focused upon what bullying is, how to respond to bullying and how wonderful it is that we are all different and special in our own ways. Allergies

Speeding Motorists & Parking

We have been contacted by the police Community Compliance Coordinator to let us know that a number of motorists have been booked of late speeding around schools and parking unsafely. For the safety of everyone, please remember to observe speed limits and be patient when finding a park.

Council officers will be undertaking parking enforcement, both morning and afternoon, on foot and in vehicles, in an effort to reduce this behaviour and make the areas around our school safer for all our students, crossing and road users. - one dollar in matched savings from ANZ for every one dollar you save, up to \$500
- Free MoneyMinded financial workshops

At the end of the program you can use your matched savings to purchase education-related items, such as a computer, laptop, school camps/excursions and text books.

To be eligible to participate in Saver Plus you must:

- be 18 years or over;
- · be a parent or guardian of a student attending school, or be attending or returning to vocational training yourself;
- have a current health care card or pensioner concession card;
- Have some form of household income, for example, your partner or you may have casual, part-time, full-time or seasonal employment.
- · Be on a commonwealth payment. This includes family tax benefit, child care rebate etc.
