

ERM 4 WEEK 2 13.10.2023

Last week we welcomed 30+ educators from around the state to a day focused on disability inclusion practices. Across the day we talked about the approaches we have in place at our school to support students both academically and in relation to emotional and/or behavioural regulation. This includes classroom adjustments (differentiated learning tasks, physical manipulatives, sensory resources, etc) as well as interventions such as Mini Lit and Multi Lit, Hands On Learning, Tutor Learning Initiative, etc. . We then led groups through classrooms to see our inclusive practices in action which was a beautiful part of the day. I am so very proud of our school and everyone in it (students and staff) so I love taking people on tours and telling them all about The West.

#### **CLC (Community Learning Challenge) is back!**

Last week we welcomed year nine students to our school again as part of the semesterly CLC (Community Learning Challenge) program. This involves students volunteering in the community to help others, therein growing their leadership skills, organisational skills and compassion. We will have 19 students joining us over the coming 7 weeks including nine working with Miss Walker in P.E., five working in classrooms (prep and Art) and five working as a 'grounds crew' for Miss Ashmead. She had them hard at work today putting in tree stakes, sanding outdoor tables, blowing paths and tidying up long grass with the whipper snipper (and they did a fabulous job!). It has also been lovely to see former Wang West students returning including Gus J, Kade H, Jayla K, Noah S, Levi S, Aurelio, Ethan R and Zoe J.

#### **Absences**

#### **School Council**

Last Monday evening the school council met again, with the meeting chaired by vice-president Rachel Hogan (who did a wonderful job in Tom's absence – thanks Rachel!)

At the meeting we discussed and approved a proposal to install a significant number of solar panels at our school (awaiting final confirmation by the Victorian School Building Authority) which would be a very exciting step forward for our school in relation to sustainable energy use.

We also discussed 2024 Parent Curriculum Contributions and how we can make the purchasing of stationary and books etc. as easy and stress free for parents and carers as possible. As such, for 2024 we are planning to return to coordinating the entire book pack on behalf of parents/carers so that families will not have to source stationary separately this year. We hope this will make the process simpler and less stressful. Further information will be sent out later in the term. Our final school council dates for the year have been set, and a plan to call for tenders soon for a new school cleaner, commencing January 2024, was approved. Further information on this will be circulated in the newsletter and through community channels in the coming weeks.

#### **Cooking Club**

A past Wangaratta West family has kindly donated some money to the school to go towards a new cooking program. The program for this term will be starting next week and will include some lucky Grade 5&6 students.

The students will be involved in selecting meals, following recipes, preparing food and, of course, cleaning up. 2 groups will be involved, each cooking fortnightly, however both groups will join together each week to eat the meal prepared as a big group. The recipes that the students have followed will also be collated and presented as a cooking book for the students.




## Stycent of Week
