Monday 21st August Book Week & Open Morning Week 2 at The West started off with a bang as we celebrated our NAPLAN data! Our students did an amazing job and I am so very proud of them.

This year, NAPLAN has changed the way it groups student results, shifting from Top 2 bands, Middle 2 bands and Bottom 2 bands, to 4 categories: Excelling, Strong, Developing and Needs additional support. The intention of this is to make it easier for parents and carers to understand the results.

Schools are also provided with data comparing their students' performance against those of similar schools. I'm thrilled to let you know that Wang West outperformed Similar Schools in every category except 1 (where we drew), and in most cases by 10% or more (see below).

My sincere apologies if this was the case.
