Camps, Sports and Excursion Funding Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families. Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made directly to the school for use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

A hard copy form has been sent home with the eldest child in each family so please fill this in if you are eligible for CSEF and return the completed form ASAP.

School Hours

Just a friendly reminder that staff supervision of students in the yard before school begins at 8:45am. Prior to this, all staff are in a staff briefing each morning and thus cannot monitor the yard. We understand that this timing may be difficult for some families which is why we have Out of School Hours care available each morning from 6:30am. Alternatively, should you wish to drop your child off before 8:45am, you may do so but please be aware that formal supervision is not available at this time and we recommend that students do not arrive before 8:30am.

Curriculum Day Friday

I'd like to sincerely thank everyone for your support with our curriculum day this week. Having a curriculum day focussed on professional development very early in the term allows staff to implement ideas immediately and consistently from the beginning of the year, minimising disruption to programs, routines and approaches. It maximises the benefit that we can all gain from working with expert consultants so we thank you for your understanding, particularly as we know as it may have caused challenges for some.

This curriculum day focussed upon the area of writing, with Misty Adoniou, a very highly regarded expert in the field, joining us again (for the second year running).

Misty was a primary school teacher for 10 years before moving to Greece and teaching and consulting in the area of English Language Teaching for 7 years. She now lectures at the University of Canberra. She has received numerous Teaching Awards including the Vice-Chancellor's Award for Teaching Excellence, and was the Lead Writer of the Federal Government's Teachers' Resource for English Additional Language/Dialect (EAL/D) learners.

Our staff raved about what they learned from working with Misty last year, so we are thrilled to welcome her back to build on prior work. This will do doubt help us to take our writing approach to the next level.

Participation and fun is the key ingredient for the 2023 Wangaratta Chronicle Marathon and Fun Run presented by Garry Nash & Co Real Estate and we especially encourage students to enter the RJ Sanderson & Associates 2km Primary School Challenge and earn points for their school.

Why should kids from your school enter?

The school with the most number of finishers will win a cash prize of \$1,000 from the event partner R J Sanderson as well as a perpetual trophy to display for the next 12 months. Every student finisher is awarded a 'finisher' point as long as they have chosen their school as their team when entering.

Smaller schools will not be disadvantaged as there is a factoring system based on the number of students in total at the school and how many students participate, so any school has the chance to win the major prize.

There will be two groups for the 2km Primary School Challenge - Racers and Chasers.

The Racers will set off at 10am and is for children of all ages who want to race hard and challenge themselves to achieve their best. No parents/carers are allowed to start in this wave.

The Chasers will begin at approximately 10.30am – this race will commence after all Racers have completed their first lap. This is for children of all ages and we encourage parent/carer participation and social completion of the event as a family – walking or running is permitted by all participants.

All children in both waves will receive a medal at the finish and their official time will be published on the website, however there will be no official placings or prizes for the fastest finishers in this event. Times on the website will not be separated by wave, but by age.

There will be no on the day entries, however registrations will be available at the Wangaratta Chronicle office until 5pm Friday March 17 or at the Wangaratta Showgrounds between 2.30pm and 5pm on Saturday March 18.
